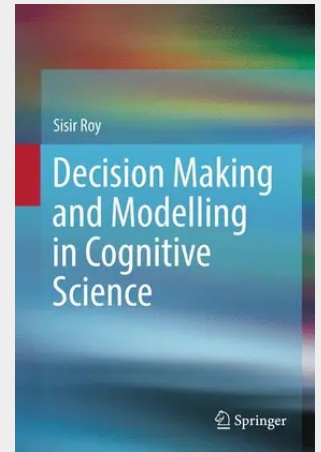


Decision Making and Modelling in Cognitive Science
