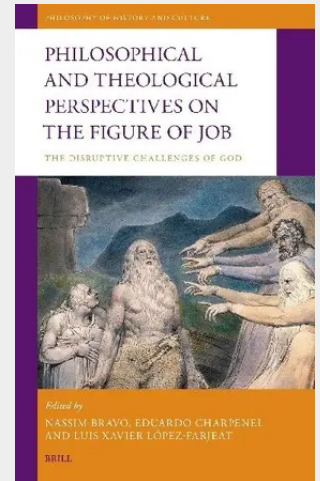


Philosophical and Theological Perspectives on the Figure of Job
