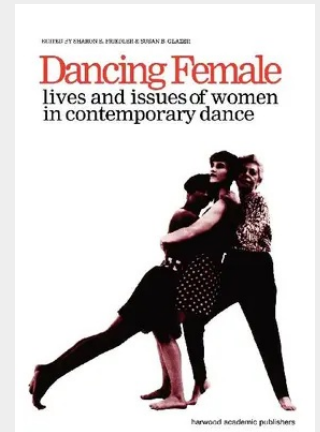


Dancing Female
