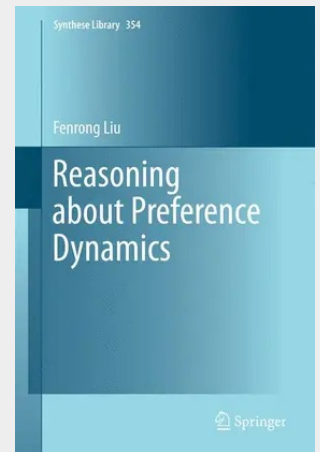


Reasoning about Preference Dynamics
