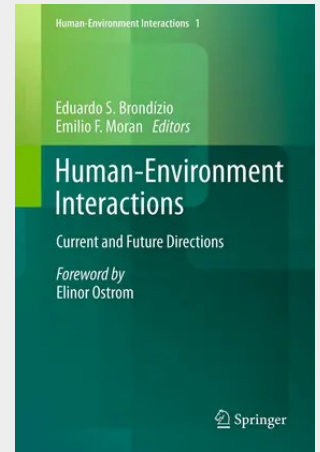


Human-Environment Interactions
