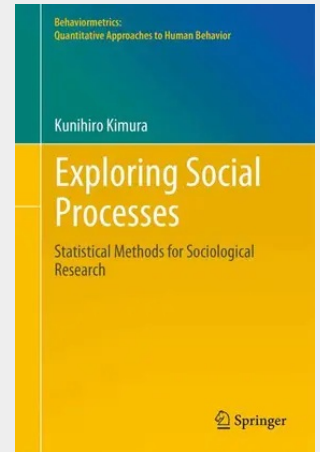
Statistical Methods for Sociological Research
